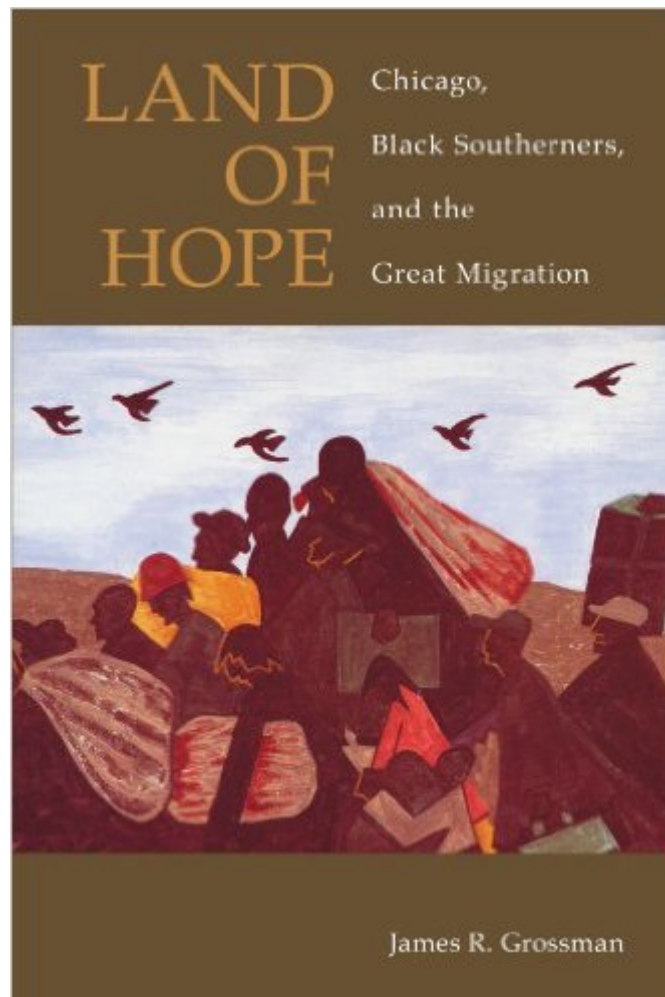


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Land Of Hope: Chicago, Black Southerners, And The Great Migration
