

The subjects raised are interesting and thought provoking, yet the book appears to be â œsinging to the convertedâ •. The conference could have been the basis for a more interlinked, focussed, outwardly accessible book. In its current guise, it just doesnâ ™t seem that inspirational and requires perhaps a little too much effort to go through. This is a shame.Quite why it took several years for this book to appear after the conference is unclear. It just makes things seem even more remote and less relevant. It would be wrong to characterise this book as being bad, but its relevance and impact could have been potentially much greater if it had been published a few years previously.
